## May 18th, 2020

The Laurens City Council met in regular session via phone conference due to the COVID-19 pandemic procedures at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, May 18th, 2020. Discussion on COVID-19 with respect to preparedness was held. After much discussion, Swanson moved to open city buildings on May 19th. Potter seconded. Ayes: Swanson, Potter, Christenson. Nays: Newgard, Jamison. Motion carried 3-2.

Discussion of the structural condition of the Earl Mackie Memorial Swimming Pool was held. Patch work will be tried to fix the issue. No action was taken.

Jamison moved to approve Resolution 08-20 to Set Public Hearing Date for the Sale of Property at 214 S. Harrison street for 5:00 p.m. for Monday, June 1st. Newgard seconded. Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Swanson, Christenson, Newgard, Jamison, Potter. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on a nuisance property. Newgard moved to approve talking to the County Board of Supervisors for possible abatement for the first step moving forward. Potter seconded. All ayes; motion carried.

Potter moved to approve Resolution 09-20 - Wages. Swanson seconded. Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Swanson, Christenson, Newgard, Jamison, Potter. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Jamison moved to approve sending the rezoning request by Kenny Kliegl to Planning and Zoning. Christenson seconded. All ayes; motion carried.

Discussion was held on demolition practices and possible solutions for the "west building." Newgard motioned to table the decision until recommendations and quotes are received. Swanson seconded. All ayes; motion carried.

Discussion was held on door locks. Reed will obtain another quote and come back with suggestion.

Potter moved to adjourn at 6:34 p.m. Jamison seconded. All ayes. Motion carried.
